## **OLD PASADENA & NORTON SIMON MUSEUM**

Old Pasadena is the city's most well-known district. Spanning 22 blocks of historic streets and alleyways Old Pasadena reflects the traditions of early California blending more than 130 retail stores, art galleries, trendy boutiques, vintage clothing stores, movie theaters and restaurants. ### **Dining**

Many eateries offer outdoor dining options which makes people watching table side a must do break from afternoon shopping or to be a part of the lively nightlife in Old Pasadena. Café Santorini. If you're in the mood for American cuisine, stop by the famed Twin Palms. No matter which one you visit, all these restaurants are exclusive to Pasadena, and provide group seating and outdoor dining.

### **Shopping & One Colorado**

In this district you'll find over 130 top retailers, boutiques, exclusive to Pasadena stores, galleries and more. Many are located in the outdoor shopping complex known as One Colorado. H & M, French Connection, Gap, Banana Republic, Crate & Barrel, Barnes & Noble, J. Crew, Lather and independently owned Flutter, Elisa B., In Soho and Soap Kitchen are just a few.

### **Norton Simon Museum**

Finish off a day at the Norton Simon Museum just a few blocks west along the parade route on Colorado boulevard. Known around the world as one of the most remarkable private art collections ever assembled. The permanent collection includes European art from the Renaissance to the 20th century with works by Van Gogh, Rembrandt, Rodin, Picasso, Diego Rivera and others and a stellar collection of South and Southeast Asian art spanning 2,000 years. Three temporary exhibition galleries feature rotating installations of artworks not on permanent display. After a light refreshment in the garden visit the gift shop for the perfect Pasadena item to bring home.
